ABOUT THE SHOW

Omnium (Latin for "of all and belonging to all") ensures everyone is in on the action in a spirited spectacular that is both limit-defying and life-affirming. In *l'mPossible*, Omnium Circus reimagines the art form of circus for 21st century audiences, bringing a new kind of excitement, thrill and joy to people of all ages and all abilities. It's a circus adventure where there are no limits, no boundaries and no barriers

l'mPossible is the story of young Dani who finds herself at odds with the world. Her journey takes her to a circus. The magic takes hold, and she takes a job as a wardrobe assistant. She soon discovers that to create that magic in herself she must confront a world full of challenges. Through a death-defying, awe-inspiring, madcap circus adventure, Dani discovers the strength, courage and perseverance that changes her life forever.

Omnium completed its first three-week tour in February and March of 2023, followed by a four-week fall tour, covering seven states. The tour reached over 10,000 people (40% of audience members identify as having disabilities) with 17 performers and four crew. We are honored to present the NYC premiere of *I'mPossible* at the New Victory Theater! The entire *I'mPossible* company is excited to share our passion for the art of circus with every single audience member!

ABOUT THE COMPANY

Everyone needs to see themselves represented in the space where the impossible becomes possible right before your eyes. The first production, A Celebration of Diversity, was created and streamed during the pandemic and viewed by over 30,000 people.

MEET THE PERFORMERS

Jen Bricker-Bauer (Aerialist) became interested in gymnastics from an early age. She was the first person without legs competing in power tumbling, against ablebodied athletes, and became a State Champion in her division as well as placing fourth all around at Jr. Olympics. Always challenging herself, Jen transitioned into an accomplished aerialist, acrobat and professional speaker. In 2015, Jen was honored to be inducted into the Gallery of Legends Hall of Fame by the World Acrobatic Society. Jen's incredible story has been featured on countless shows in over 100 countries, including HBO's Real Sports, 20/20, and Good Morning America. Jen has performed and/or spoken in 23 countries around the world. Madison Square Garden, Staples Center, Palazzo Hotel, Budokan Arena in Tokyo are just a few of the stages she's been blessed to perform on. Her first book, Everything Is Possible, hit The New York Times Best Seller list in 2016 and since has been translated into 11 languages.

Dominik Bauer (*Trombonist*) is Jen's husband. Born and raised in Austria, he is an accomplished musician and music teacher. He has performed with classical orchestras and bands in Europe. In 2018, Dominik made his operatic debut in Austria as Figaro in Mozart's *Le Nozze de Figaro*. The couple have joined their talents, traveling the world speaking and performing together, and recently welcomed their first baby, Malachi into the family in July 2023.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Don't be afraid to be yourself on stage—it makes you shine!

What do you hope people take away from the show?

We want people to see they aren't a mistake, they're here for a reason, and they truly have something valuable to offer the world through their gifts and talents!

Which act brings you the most joy?

Our act of course! Being able to perform together, combining both of our talents and passions after years of solo performing is truly a gift!

Rik Daniels (Dancer/Acrobat) was the poster child for the March of Dimes and later appeared on CBS's Sunday Morning and Ripley's Believe it or Not! for his achievements as a NYC high-school champion gymnast. He went on to become a seven-time NCAA All American on pommel horse, parallel bars and still rings. Rik continues to inspire through modeling, dancing and performance art. He's worked extensively with Jim Self and the New York State DanceForce, was a principal dancer in Michael Franti and Spearhead's "Once a Day" music video; collaborated with Tina Christina-Price in contemporary dance; and continues to partner with Nicole Agaronnik and American Dancewheels Foundation using a fusion of Contemporary and Ballroom/Latin Dance choreography. What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Find a community of circus folk, near or far, to inspire and coach you! Focus on what you love to do, even if it isn't necessarily what you do "best."

What do you hope people take away from the show?

Our differences can be our strengths! And every one is a contribution, just as we are!

Which act brings you the most joy?

Bell ringing with the clowns, because the "kids" of all ages have the opportunity to participate and shine!

Tersit Asefa Dersu (Dani/Juggling/Cube) grew up in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. Trained and certified by Ethio Selam Circus School in Addis Ababa, she has been involved in professional circus sports since early childhood. She has been performing her solo bounce juggling act professionally for over 12 years on different circus stages around the world. Tersit is very excited to be working with Omnium Circus!

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Always do your best and enjoy it!

What do you hope people take away from the show?

I hope that everyone is joyful and amazed to share memorable moments with these talented performers.

Which act brings you the most joy?

I love and appreciate all the acts.

Ottavio Gesmundo & Naomi Brenkman Gesmundo (Crossbow Artists) are two-time Guinness World Record Holders and have extensive performing credits that include Elton John & Tim Rice's Aida in The Netherlands, The Tonight Show with Conan O'Brien and Le Plus Grand Cabaret du Monde. Ottavio hails from six generations of circus performers and is the co-author of the award-winning memoir The Grand Gypsy. He was an original cast member of the musical Saturday Night Fever on Broadway. Naomi was born in Utrecht, Holland, where she began her martial arts training at the age of three. She attended the Royal Academy of Ballet in Amsterdam and then graduated from the Academy of Dance in Rotterdam. She was Resident Director/Choreographer, Dance Captain for the musical Miss Saigon and an original member of the hit recording group Alice DeeJay.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Naomi: Be mindful of the presentation and learn how to dance or move well between your key moments.

Ottavio: Study old circus acts to see what made them great. Perhaps you'll find something that no one else is doing and make it new again.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

Naomi: I hope they have a blast.

Ottavio: That they want to come back and bring their friends!

Which act brings you the most joy?

Naomi: The crossbow of course! I love performing this act with my husband, and it gives me immense joy. However, watching Tiffany Riley and Dick Monday perform clowning is so fun.

Ottavio: The opening number when we all get to perform together.

King Charles Troupe (Unicycle Basketball) The world-renowned King Charles Unicycle Troupe, which made its debut as the first all-Black group to perform with Ringling Bros.

and Barnum & Bailey Circus in 1969. Now in its 5th generation continuing their style of high-energy basketball on unicycles!

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Master the basics of your circus discipline—training is essential and having a diverse skill set can make you a more versatile performer.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

Inspiration and aspiration while leaving a lasting impact on our audience.

Which act brings you the most joy?

Our opening and finale acts.

Elayne Kramer (Contortionist) is a remarkable 6th generation circus performer hailing from Argentina. Her journey in the circus world began at the tender age of four under the guidance of her father, and by the age of seven, she was mesmerizing audiences as a contortionist. Throughout her career, Elayne has honed her skills as a hand balancing and contortion artist, earning her a reputation as one of the finest of her generation. Her extraordinary talent has been acknowledged with numerous accolades, including a Bronze Clown at the International Circus Festival of Monte Carlo in 2008. Elayne was a featured artist in the Big Apple Circus' 35th anniversary production Legendarium. In addition to her live performances, Elayne has also showcased her skills on various television shows, including The Ellen DeGeneres Show, Good Morning America and Live with Kelly and Michael.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

If you are passionate about something, put that same energy and positivity into becoming something amazing and you will.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

l'mPossible is such an inspirational show. People from all walks of life are a part of this amazing cast! I hope that anyone that gets a chance to experience this show will feel inspired by the art that we are all passionate about and that no dream is too great to accomplish.

Which act brings you the most joy?

I appreciate and love all athletic and acrobatic acts, but I believe the roots of a happy life are laughter and joy, so I would have to say that comedy is my favorite part of any show!

Dick Monday & Tiffany Riley (Clowns) have partnered for the past thirty years, headlining at circuses and festivals worldwide. Dick was Director of the Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Clown College and Tiffany wrote a respected book on healthcare clowning Beyond the Red Nose. They co-founded the Laughter League, a non-profit organization providing therapeutic clown services to hospitalized children in pediatric hospitals across the country as well as to people living with dementia. They are thrilled to be part of Omnium Circus.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Never give up on your dreams. You can achieve anything that you put your whole heart and mind into.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

I hope folks will see the magic of circus the way that we do. There is no more inclusive art form than the circus. Circus is family.

Which act brings you the most joy?

Rik Daniels, because he has taken all of life's challenges and turned them into opportunities. Every moment he is on stage, his joy at being there is palpable and infectious!

Malik Paris (Poet/Dancer) is a Deaf performance artist based in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He has performed a wide range of work, from young audience performances to Fringe Festival creations. He has been a performer and member of the ASL poetry variety performance troupe Dangerous Signs since 2011.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Experiment and be creative with what you want to express or share.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

To spread the word about this extraordinary show!

Which act brings you the most joy?

Singing and signing along with kids in the audience. I love to watch talented artists perform.

Owen Sanchez (Hand Balancing) is a fourth-generation circus performer. He practiced gymnastics from age 9 until age 14, becoming a medalist in the Mexican nationals. His first appearance in a circus ring was at age 15, performing a trampoline act and comedy acrobatics. At age 18 he started to pursue the high handstand, a discipline which has taken him to various prestigious shows and events around the world, one of them being the 2022 international circus festival Circuba in Cuba.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Discipline and patience.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

I hope they are inspired to step beyond their comfort zones and explore new passions or challenges.

Which act brings you the most joy?

Flying trapeze.

Danette Sheppard-Vaughn (Ringmaster) was the first featured female vocalist in the 147-year history of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Circus. Danette began singing at the Memorial Baptist Church in Harlem at the age of 14. Since making her professional debut, she has amassed an impressive list of musical theater credits including sharing the stage with music legends like Patti LaBelle and Gladys Knight, numerous regional theater productions, a European tour of Jesus Christ Superstar and a leading role in the Off-Broadway production of Red Hot Broadway, to name a few.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

I have the same advice for all types of performers. Perfect your craft, be professional and be nice. That will cause you to work steadily as a performer.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

I hope they leave the show with renewed motivation, determination and purpose in their lives, knowing that they are POSSIBLE!

Which act brings you the most joy?

I don't have a favorite—everyone together is magical and fabulous, which brings unspeakable joy!

Evgeny Vasilenko (Slack Wire/Cyr Wheel) represents a well-known circus family in Russia. In 1992 he started to rehearse as a circus performer in the National Circus School of Moscow. After graduating with his diploma, he was employed by the Old Moscow Circus where he continued to improve his professional skills in acting and a variety of dance styles.

What advice do you have for aspiring circus performers?

Don't give up! It will be difficult at times, but continue.

What do you hope people take away from the show?

I hope for a little bit of happiness. During the show I hope they forgot about their problems.

Which act brings you the most joy?

I always like clowns, so Tiffany and Dick! I also like the crossbow act with Ottavio and Naomi.

MEET THE CREATIVE AND PRODUCTION TEAM

NOE ESPAÑA (Artistic Director) For 20 years, Noe has been a collaborator and guiding light in the programming, direction and production of circus-themed entertainment. A fifth-generation heir to an impressive range of circus talent and history, Noe has roots in Europe and North America. He knows the business from the performer side as well as from behind the scenes, having worked in production, direction and logistics. Challenged and inspired by the most incredible acts in the circus repertoire, he has pushed the envelope with his interpretations of the Flying Trapeze, Wheel of Destiny and Globe of Death, among other aerial and thrill acts, winning a Silver Clown at the International Circus Festival in Monte Carlo. In 2007, he won the prestigious Action Maverick Award presented by MacArthur Genius Award choreographer and dance maverick Elizabeth Streb. He has appeared on FOX's KISS in Concert and performed at The Sydney Opera House, with Ringling Brothers Circus USA at Madison Square Garden and in Japan, in USA Championship Auto Shows at Six Flags Parks, and at the Walmart's Annual Shareholders' Meeting with Queen Latifah.

LISA B. LEWIS (Founder & Executive Director/Access Coordinator) A graduate of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Clown College, Lisa also has a BA from Brandeis University and an MA in clown and circus history from NYU. She co-founded the Super Scientific Circus and worked with the Big Apple Circus in multiple capacities for many years. She then founded Omnium: A Bold New Circus with the mission to include and welcome the beautiful mosaic of humans who make up our world, creating joy and entertainment for all—no matter the bodies they inhabit. She is a recognized leader in the area of DEAIB (Diversity, Equity, Accessibility, Inclusion and Belonging) and a passionate advocate for making the magic of the performing arts available to all.

WILLIAM MEADE (Co-Producer/Composer/Lyricist) has produced television and Broadway shows, concerts, podcasts, recordings, touring productions and large-scale events around the world for two decades. He has worked with Johnny Cash, Bob Dylan, David Bowie, Aretha Franklin, Twyla Tharp, Mikhail Baryshnikov, Rudolf Nureyev, Carol Channing and Stevie Wonder, as well as with global leaders such as Henry Kissinger, George Bush Sr., Jimmy Carter, Roh Moo-hyun and Susilo Bambang. He has produced more than 20 performing arts tours in 24 countries, from South and North America to Asia and Europe.

OTTAVIO GESMUNDO & NAOMI BRENKMAN GESMUNDO (On-Site Directors/ Choreographers) are proud to be Resident Director and Choreographers for Omnium Circus. Their dance and stunt choreography credits include Spider-Man Live! at Radio City Music Hall, the National Tour of Pippin at Goodspeed Opera House, The Circus Starring Britney Spears (tour video), Contemporary West Dance Theatre, Las Vegas Civic Ballet, CIRQUESA, The Vampire Circus and Krystallpalast Variety Theatre in Leipzig, Germany.

PETER BUFANO (*Music Composer/Director*) is a composer and multi-instrumentalist who creates original music for movies and circuses. He is a graduate of Ringling Bros. and Barnum & Bailey Clown College and The Berklee College of Music. His early scores were largely acoustic instrumentals influenced by jazz and Eastern European folk music. He released six CDs with his group Cirkestra. Later works expanded to incorporate orchestral and electronic elements. He is an Assistant Professor of Screen Scoring at Berklee College of Music and was the 2019 Newbury Comics Fellow for his work in circus music.

JACOB AVINER (*Music Composer*) is a guitarist, composer, producer and educator based in Brooklyn, New York. He has toured both on the East Coast and in the Pacific Northwest with different acts, and his group Porterfield has been twice nominated for Jazz Artist of the Year by the Boston Music Awards. EVAN HAWKINS (*Lighting Designer/Technical Director*) is a New York City-based lighting professional. He has experience in multiple disciplines of lighting such as events, TV, theater, architecture and now the circus. He has spent time touring the United States as the head electrician/production manager for Aruba Productions on their national tours of *C.S. Lewis: The Most Reluctant Convert, C.S. MIRIAM ROCHFORD (*Stage Manager*) is an AEA stage manager who works in as many different genres of performance as she can, ranging from opera to film to the circus! Also an ASL interpreter, Miriam is happiest when she's working with deaf artists.

MADYSON BARNFIELD (Company Manager) is a New York-based production and company manager. She is very excited to be working with Omnium Circus for the first time! Thanks to Lisa. Evan, Miriam, and the whole cast and crew for their passion!

MARIE DAGENAIS-LEWIS (Social Media Director) is an anti-ableist thought leader, pridefully-disabled storyteller, and community galvanizer with an extensive background in broadcasting and communications. After ableism and disability

discrimination rocked her world, she blazed a new trail through art activism. As the creator behind @r.a.r.e.advoc8, her work challenges the status quo by exploring and embracing the complexities of a rare, disabled neurodivergent experience in an ableist society. She has spoken about anti-ableism and inclusion at events such as the NCIL 2022 National Conference and the Facebook Communities Global Summit. Some of her proudest projects include the Power in Pride Celebration for Disability Pride Month and her self-published *Chronically Spooky* hand-drawn coloring book series. She was inducted into the Susan B. Daniels Disability Mentoring Hall of Fame in 2022 and was a finalist in the 2022 Social Health Awards in the Community Cultivator category. She works to diversify the arts behind the scenes through her work as Director of Social Media for the ground-breaking Omnium Circus, America's first fully inclusive and accessible nonprofit circus.

JODY BETH LAFOSSE (Executive Assistant) assists Founder and Director Lisa B. Lewis with operations, marketing and development. Outside of Omnium, she provides freelance editing and transcription support to authors, journalists, scholars, conference organizers and musicians. She comes to Omnium with a grounding in the arts, culture, writing and social justice, along with a keen interest in accessibility that she began cultivating as a graduate student in urban planning at the USC Sol Price School of Public Policy. In addition, she has a BA in English from SUNY Binghamton. BRYAN VELASQUEZ (Community Outreach) always wanted to be a Braille teacher, but in college, he realized that teaching wasn't the right career path. He discovered therapeutic recreation and stayed with this until graduation. During his practice, he had the honor of serving the geriatric population, which included stroke and dementia patients, and also practiced at Coney Island Hospital in Brooklyn, New York, and Hearthstone Palisades in Palisades, New York. His desire to join the circus began with an activity in his dementia residence using a video that explained the loading and unloading of the Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus. The sawdust started to build in his veins. From discovering his voiceover talent to giving back to his very own blind community, he considers it an honor to be a part of this amazing institution.

Land Acknowledgement

We are on the island known as Mannahatta, now called Manhattan, in Lenapehoking, the homeland of the Lenape people. These lands are intertribal trade lands under the stewardship of many Nations, and New Victory acknowledges the systematic erasure of their true history.

The land of the five boroughs that make up New York City was and still is inhabited by the Lenape, Merrick, Canarsie, Rockaway and Matinecock Nations. We celebrate and pay deep respect to the Peoples of these Nations, their cultures, their communities, their elders past and present, those with us today, and all their future generations.

We recognize that seized lands are historically inhabited by people who are racialized, marginalized and displaced by those in power, and we offer this land acknowledgement as a step in reexamining our relationship to that history. We offer our gratitude to the Indigenous peoples of many the Nations who continue to act as stewards of the land, and we encourage you to learn more about these vibrant communities.







BROADWAY TO BURLESQUE

This theater was built in 1900 by Oscar Hammerstein I as the Theatre Republic. On the roof, he created the Paradise Gardens, which featured a stage, dance floor and a miniature Dutch village. In 1902, impresario David Belasco bought the venue, gave it his name and installed an orchestra pit. In the 1930s Billy Minsky turned the theater into Broadway's first burlesque club, Minsky's Republic, which boasted showgirls and a flashy façade.



SILVER SCREEN

In 1942, Mayor LaGuardia banned burlesque, and Minsky's was no more. In a burst of WWII patriotism, the theater was renamed The Victory and showed first-run films. Over the next 30 years, Times Square declined into abject decay. In 1972, the theater became the block's only XXX-rated movie house.



NEW VICTORY

The theater as it is known today opened in 1995 as the city's first theater for children and families. As one of seven restored theaters under New 42's stewardship, the New Victory is just one way in which the New 42 makes the arts a part of everyone's life from the earliest years onward!


